At Porchlight, we acknowledge that our organization operates on the traditional territories of the Anishinaabe, Haudenosaunee, Neutral, and Mississauga First Nations, who are the original caretakers of this land. We are situated on lands connected to the Haldimand Treaty of 1784, which promised six miles of land on both sides of the Grand River would belong to the Six Nations of the Grand River. This agreement has never been fully honoured and remains part of ongoing, living disputes to this day.

The complex history that has led to us residing on this land is inseparable from colonialism and the pain it has caused. As a counselling and addictions organization, we recognize that acknowledging and understanding past and present harms and injustices is essential to any healing journey, both for individuals and for societies.

Reconciliation requires more than acknowledgment; it demands humility, accountability, and meaningful action. At Porchlight, we are committed, both individually and collectively, to educating ourselves, building grounded relationships with Indigenous communities, and taking concrete steps toward positive change. This includes supporting Indigenous-led initiatives, advocating for Indigenous rights, and incorporating Indigenous perspectives into our organizational practices.

Together, we can work towards healing, reconciliation, and a future of mutual respect and understanding.

In 1940, Porchlight was created by members of this community to provide residents of what is now Cambridge with services to support them as they dealt with the traumas and trials imposed by the Second World War.

Every year since has been a stepping stone to where we are today - a multi-faceted organization providing accessible services that are grounded in the needs of Cambridge and North Dumfries.

Our work has always been rooted in the needs of our community, and our community has been asking us to continue to expand to meet the growing complexity with the intersection of multiple crises – mental health, addictions, and homelessness. This past year we have worked hard to grow to meet this need. Some this year's most notable achievements include:

- A 38% increase in the number of unique individuals participating in Porchlight's programs.
- The launch of a new program that directly supports and houses homeless veterans in our community - bringing us full circle on our organization's origins.
- Our move to a new, bright, accessible, and expanded space for counselling services.

- The opening and operation of an overnight warming centre, providing 7-day a week access for those experiencing unsheltered homelessness during winter's coldest months.
- Expanded our reach in our community through robust new partnerships, such as new ways to involve partners in Cambridge Moves for Mental Health which more than doubled the turnout for the event.

In 2024-25, Porchlight experienced an increase of 38% in the number of unique individuals accessing our programs.



Porchlight's team of registered psychotherapists & MSWs continue to provide accessible counselling services in Cambridge and North Dumfries.

During the 2024-25 year, 2,611 unique individuals accessed these services.

COUNSELLING PROGRAMS

Taming the Dragon is an in-school program, which provided 2687 children with tools and techniques to help manage and overcome anxiety in the last two years.

Going into the 2025-26 school year, only ~15% of this program's full capacity costs are funded, which will reduce its availability and impact.

TAMING THE DRAGON

Porchlight offers a range of addiction services which begin with assessment & treatment planning and walk with individuals all the way through aftercare and relapse prevention.

Thanks to generous support from Upstream Waterloo, in the coming year, Porchlight will be offering addiction recovery groups in Ayr for the first time.

ADDICTION SERVICES

Among our addiction services,
Porchlight operates Waterloo Region's
only two sober living homes for
addiction recovery.

Between these homes, we maintain 19 beds of transitional housing for individuals with a recent history experiencing addiction who are otherwise unhoused or living in unsafe conditions.

During the 2024-25 year, 42 unique individuals stayed in Porchlight's recovery homes, an increase from the 32 in 2023-24.

RECOVERY HOMES

In the coming year, Porchlight is embarking on an ambitious project to explore feasible options for expanding the capacity of our Recovery Homes program, and to provide a model for recovery housing that can be used to scale similar programs in other communities.

BUILDING FOR RECOVERY

For over 25 years, Porchlight has been combatting isolation, and its mental health impacts, among seniors in rural areas through Young at Heart.

This program offers weekly lunches, speakers, connections, and points of access to other services.

YOUNG AT HEART

This year, for the first time, Porchlight operated an Overnight Warming Centre in Cambridge to ensure everyone in our community could access warmth and safety, even during the winter's coldest nights.

Use of this facility peaked at over 40 individuals per night, with at least 85 unique individuals accessing it during its operation.

For the first time in 2025, we invited other community organizations which make a positive impact on mental health to fundraise through this event. This means your support had a broader impact than ever before.

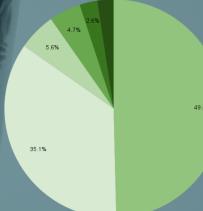

FINANCIAL SUMMARY (EXPENSES)

In 2024-25, Porchlight's excess revenue over expenses showed a deficiency of \$19,790, or 0.78% of revenue.

Porchlight's end of year balance was \$1,968,610, which includes both a five month operating reserve and \$891,991 which was realized by the sale of property in 2023 and is internally reserved for future capital investment.
