## Local counselling centre renamed **Porchlight**

By Irene Schmidt-Adeney The Family Counselling Centre of Cambridge and North Dumfries (FCCCND) has "dropped the long geography" from its name, and is now Porchlight Counselling and Addiction Services.

"After welcoming the Cambridge Addiction Services program to our team in 2019 and going through a Strategic Planning process in 2022, our Board and Staff decided that our organization needed a new name that better reflected the breadth of programs and services we offer," said Executive Director Cameron Dearlove.

The new name and branding identity was announced on Tuesday, October 11 at the Men's Recovery Home located at Wanner Mennonite Church in Cambridge.

"To arrive somewhere - perhaps after a long and difficult journey - to find the Porchlight has been left on tells you that you have arrived at a place where people care about you,' said Dearlove. "This is the feeling we want everyone walking through our doors to have: no

matter your journey, we are leaving the Porchlight on because we care about you, and we are glad that you arrived."

The FCCCND began offering services in North Dumfries in 1998 and after several moves was provided with an office as part of the North Dumfries Community Health Centre. located at the North Dumfries Community Complex (NDCC). The organization also offers the Young at Heart community lunches offered for seniors every Friday at Knox United Church.

"For over two decades our organization has been serving North Dumfries, and this will

continue to be a priority for us," said Dearlove. "We have staff on-site in Ayr four days a week, both for providing counselling as well as community outreach. Always popular is our seniors' lunch held every Friday at Knox Church with over 50 seniors attending each week. It is our hope that our work in North Dumfries only continues to grow in our next chapter as Porchlight Counselling and Addiction Services."

In-person counselling is offered at the NDCC location on Tuesday, 11:00 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. and Thursday, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Community Outreach is offered at the NDCC

on Wednesday, 9:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Young at Heart Lunches are Fridays at 12:00 noon at Knox United Church.
